



Holistically Empowering Freedom

PREVENTION

Increasing Awareness, Decreasing Vulnerability

We lead various awareness campaigns and events, collaborate with local law enforcement and organizations for support and education, and carry products in our online store that support at-risk communities in regions where we work.

INTERVENTION

Finding & Freeing Victims, Supporting Arrests

Our core focus lies in identifying victims and assisting law enforcement to rescue them. We believe that when human trafficking practices and networks are interrupted today, we are preventing countless victims from being enslaved tomorrow. This is a strategic, effective, and long-term approach to bringing about positive social change.

AFTERCARE

Ongoing Support for Survivors

We are committed to assisting survivors in several significant ways as they take their first steps of freedom. We employ social workers and crisis care workers-all nationals in their own countries-in India, Thailand, and Latin America. We support efforts of local, private aftercare shelters in countries where we work that specialize in caring for human trafficking victims. We also carry ethically sourced, survivor-made products in our online store.

"90% of the victims we help rescue currently are male minors—boys who are victims of grooming or exploitation on social media. The other 10% are male and female minors sold by establishments like bars and massage parlors. We think online cases will increase since the government is serious about suppressing human trafficking. Traffickers go online because they think they are safe and won't get caught; but because of what we are doing with law enforcement, they are wrong."

RENOVATING A CHILDREN'S TESTIMONY ROOM


The Exodus Road formed a unique partnership with the Chiang Mai police to renovate a children's testimony room for the Center for Children, Women and Family Protection & Prevention and Suppression of Human Trafficking. It is now a welcoming, comforting place where the Center's team can interview survivors and gather evidence to prosecute cases. The team is composed of a psychologist, social worker, prosecutor, legal advisor for children, and an investigator from the Chiang Mai Police Department. The Center will use this space as a model for future testimony rooms throughout the country.

ROYAL THAI POLICE AWARD

The Exodus Road was among six NGOs recognized by the Royal Thai Police for contributing to the significant improvement in preventing and suppressing human trafficking in Thailand. The award came after the U.S. Department of State's Office to Monitor and Combat Trafficking in Persons upgraded Thailand's ranking to Tier 2 in its 2018 Trafficking in Persons (TIP) Report. This marks Thailand's best ranking in the TIP Report in a decade.

During an awards ceremony, the Royal Thai Police highlighted two cases facilitated by The Exodus Road in April 2018. The missions led to the rescue of two boys and one girl and the arrest of two traffickers and six clients. Other organizations recognized for their efforts to prevent and suppress human trafficking include the U.S. Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), U.S. Homeland Security Investigations, and the Australia-Asia Program to Combat Trafficking in Persons.





OPERATION WEB

ALPHA Team found a public post on social media with an audacious statement:

"14-year-old boy sold for sex. Anyone interested in the service, call this phone."

TER operatives immediately launched investigations to learn more about the pimp who made the post and the young boy he was selling.

BACKSTORY

ALPHA Team found out that the boy, Kamon*, was a 9th grader from a poor family in a rural area who had dropped out of school because his parents could no longer afford to send him. The 20-year-old pimp told the boy's parents (whom he knew well) that he'd give their son a job carrying luggage at a hotel. In reality, he recruited Kamon to provide sexual services for older men.

RESCUE

While Kamon's abuse had been ongoing for an entire year, it took ALPHA Team only two weeks after discovering the social media post to gather enough evidence to present to law enforcement to conduct an operation. The pimp was arrested by local Thai police, and Kamon was rescued and given counseling at the safe house where he now resides.

FUTURE

Recently, one of our Thai staff members gave us an update on Kamon. He is now learning a trade and plans on returning to school in the near future. His social worker reported,

"The boy has a new life. He looks totally different. He looks so very happy. He is not exploited by anyone anymore, and he has a future."

SECURITY WALL FOR AFTERCARE PARTNER

In our continuing quest to support best in class aftercare for rescued victims of sex trafficking, we granted \$10,000 to an aftercare facility to build a security wall around their property. This newly formed home provides victims of human trafficking with safe shelter, medical and psychological examinations, and job training.


PROVIDING TESTIMONY

BRAVO Team spent a significant amount of time in court testifying on behalf of trafficking victims they helped rescue. Their first-person accounts provided critical evidence against traffickers that led to stronger cases and more convictions in 2018.

SOCIAL WORKERS

In India, we employed three full-time social workers who tirelessly supported and cared for survivors-often distraught and confused during and after rescue. We recently asked our social workers about the role they play, and they replied simply, "Our role is to give comfort and courage. We also build trust so victims are able to give more accurate and truthful reporting and testimony to police so traffickers can be arrested."





OPERATION RELENTLESS

Kamini*, a 14-year-old girl from rural India, was first rescued from a brothel in February 2018. She was left in the care of the local Child Welfare Committee (CWC). Unfortunately, Kamini's journey toward freedom quickly took a turn for the worse.

FRAUD & COERCION

Just 10 days after Kamini's rescue, a female sex trafficker approached the CWC with fake documents for her. The CWC accepted a bribe and handed Kamini back over to the woman—and back to a life of sexual abuse.

FOUND & RESCUED AGAIN

Determined to find Kamini again, our team in India orchestrated Operation RELENTLESS. For 50 days, BRAVO Team searched tirelessly for her, adamant about finding and freeing her and ensuring her perpetrators be brought to justice.

After many investigations, they found her in a brothel. Working with police, the team arrested three female perpetrators and rescued Kamini, two other minors, and a 24-year-old woman found at the scene. Kamini was with the same trafficker who presented the fake documents and took her from the CWC.

CORRUPTION EXPOSED


The Exodus Road wasn't the only organization to learn of the bribe that led to Kamini's recapture. Word reached national news channels and was spread to the public, exposing the CWC's corruption. TER also took the case to higher government officials and demanded a Crime Investigation Department (CID) investigation. As a result, the CWC members involved were dismissed from their positions.

BACK TO SAFETY

Kamini was placed in a shelter home for rescued minor girls and is now safe. BRAVO Team told us that Kamini was especially remarkable because, despite the suffering she had endured, she exhibited a calm demeanor and kind spirit.

TWO NEW INVESTIGATORS HIRED

In 2018, CHARLIE Team (South) proudly welcomed two new investigators to the team. Each operative has served in the military for close to 25 years. When describing his team, our Latin America Country Director said, "The investigators we have here are very detail-oriented, program-oriented, agendaoriented, and they prioritize. They have grown up with standards their entire military careers, and they serve the greater good."

\$20,000 PARTNERSHIP WITH **AFTERCARE CENTER**

The Exodus Road formed a new partnership with a large aftercare center in Latin America. We provided salaries for two full-time social workers, and the facility is now the first choice for placement of girls we help rescue. Working hand-in-hand with an aftercare center we trust allows us to better ensure the continued safety and support of survivors as they heal and rebuild their lives.


MISSION BREAKTHROUGH

CHARLIE Team (South) is our newest team in the field. Since their official launch in 2017, they've faced challenges unique to their country and culture. At first, the team was discouraged by the significant amount of time it took to get started and to build trust and rapport with law enforcement; but the waiting, planning, and strategizing wasn't in vain.

In 2018, CHARLIE Team (South) experienced a breakthrough. They worked successfully with police on several massive operations that resulted in significant rescues and arrests, pushing our organizational rescue total over the milestone of 1,000.

LATIN AMERICA MISSION STORY

OPERATION MAGNITUDE

CHARLIE Team (South) was exploring a dangerous part of the city–infamous for prostitution, drug and organ trafficking, and smuggling–when they discovered a nightclub with a high presence of immigrants and minor girls. The building housed a bar, dancing stage, and rooms where workers could offer sexual services to customers. Sex trafficking was clearly occurring.

Our team began carefully gathering the evidence needed for the police to take the case. Several months later, Operation MAGNITUDE was set in motion. Survivors were rescued, arrests were made, and CHARLIE Team (South) further developed key relationships with law enforcement partners.

THE SURVIVORS

Dozens of adult women and minor girls were recovered. Many were immigrants, from poor families, and brought to the brothel with the promise of a job. CHARLIE Team (South) learned that upon arrival, the victims were given food, allowance, and lodging. Then, however their documents were taken from them, and they were forced to work to pay off their expenses. Due to security concerns, we cannot publicly announce the actual number of survivors.

THE OFFENDERS

The primary clientele at this particular brothel were homeless or low-income individuals and drug dealers. Numerous traffickers and pimps were arrested onsite and sent to jail. They faced charges of human trafficking, sexual exploitation, kidnapping, and induction to prostitution.

THE OPERATIVES

The team was excited that the operation was such an overwhelming success. Though the investigators had faced significant danger gathering the necessary evidence, the impact of the case underscored their deep commitment to rescue work in their home country.

CHARLIE TEAM (NORTH)

In 2018, CHARLIE Team (North) had four members working in the U.S.one data analyst, two investigators, and one operations manager. The team worked both online-in the Cyber Operations Center-and on the ground gathering evidence of human trafficking.

Throughout the year, CHARLIE Team (North) continued to build partnerships with local police and authorities in Colorado. Additionally, the team established a partnership with Mesa Police Department's HEaT (Human Exploitation and Trafficking) Unit in Arizona. Moving forward, we will be partnering in a cyber investigative capacity, utilizing our operatives to identify traffickers, as well as funding an investigator for their team for one year.

DELTA TEAM

DELTA Team is composed of 38 expertly trained Western operatives who deploy to countries where The Exodus Road operates to assist our field teams with active cases. In 2018, DELTA had three deployments: two to Latin America, one to Southeast Asia. DELTA operatives augment our international teams when Westerners are needed to carry out undercover operations. These men and women are dedicated volunteers.







COMMUNITY VOLUNTEERS



In June of 2018, The Exodus Road had the opportunity to present to over 15,000 professionals at the MDRT Foundation's Annual Meeting in Los Angeles. In two presentations, CEO Matt Parker shared with MDRT members about the prevalence of human trafficking and ways to fight it within different contexts. In one breakout session, Operation TraffickWatch®, Matt trained members on how to specifically recognize signs of human trafficking and report suspicious activity.
